Please note:

- 1 People who are bankrupt, or have recently been sentenced to 3 months or more of imprisonment [without the option of a fine], may not serve as governors. Because appointment as a school governor will give access to children, the school will apply for a Disclosure and Barring Service check in respect of all governors.
- 2 A person may not be a parent governor of a school if s/he works at that school for more than 500 hours in a school year (ie for more than one-third of the hours of a full time post).
- 3 The term 'parent' includes guardians, foster parents and any person who has custody of a pupil at the school.
